# Village preps for next phase of reopening

Hinsdale trustees discussed a variety of initiatives Tuesday night to cope with current restrictions caused by the COVID-19 pandemic and prepare for the time when some will be lifted.

Trustees unanimously approved a resolution petitioning Gov. JB Pritzker to disconnect Hinsdale from the Cook County health region in his “Restore Illinois” plan and give village officials more autonomy.

“We are in the northeast region, which is the same region as Cook County,” Village President Tom Cauley said. “Cook County has a much bigger problem than we have.”

The resolution asks the governor to allow the village to “adopt its own community-specific transition plan and set of standards for determining when and how its restaurants, stores and other businesses can open,” balancing public health needs with economic interests.

Cauley underscored the statement in the resolution that a majority of the confirmed COVID-19 cases in Hinsdale — and all of the deaths — are related to ManorCare on Ogden Avenue.

“(ManorCare officials) indicate to us they are bringing the issue under control,” he said.

The village has been making plans to provide outdoor seating for restaurants when they are allowed to re-open with limited capacity in Phase 4. At his press conference Wednesday, Pritzker announced he will allow bars and restaurants to open for outdoor seating on May 29 when the state is expected to enter Phase 3.

“We’ve already ordered the barriers to close the streets,” Cauley told The Hinsdalean Wednesday afternoon, just two hours after the announcement. “I think it’s the right thing to do.”

Police Chief Brian King and Deputy Chief Tom Lillie have created a plan to place concrete jersey barriers in front of restaurants on First, Second and Washington streets, Village Place and Hinsdale Avenue to create outdoor seating areas. Traffic will be limited to one way on several streets.

“We can reconfigure the jersey barriers to add more seats if need be, but I think we can accommodate all the traffic that would be downtown, have outdoor seating, accommodate carryouts and not impede any of the retail sales by putting these up,” Cauley said.

The plan has the support of the Hinsdale Chamber of Commerce and the economic development commission, he noted.

“I think Tom Lillie and Chief King did a good job reaching out to each of the restaurant owners and figuring out what would

work for them,” he said Tuesday night.

Some restaurant owners have asked if they could set up tents, village manager Kathleen Gargano told trustees. She said it’s important to remember the plan is still conceptual — and fluid.

“It may change from what it looks like today to implementation and it could change four weeks later depending on the need,” Gargano said.

Similar conversations are taking place with restaurants in Grant and Gateway squares and retailers, she added.

The economic development commission is working to support businesses as well, commission Chair Jill Sunderson reported.

“We’re really focused on how do we drive awareness of our residents to shop local at these retail-facing stores and driving foot traffic downtown,” she told trustees.

Sunderson has been working with Heather Bereckis, superintendent of parks and recreation, and Sammy Hanzel, recreation supervisor, who have devoted some of their time to this effort while Anna March, who normally heads up economic development, is on maternity leave.

They created the “Hinsdale to Go” Facebook group, a recent “Mother’s Day to Go” promotion and this week’s Virtual Restaurant Week, she said. A promotion for Father’s Day on June 21 is in the works and a “Shop, Dine, Relax” campaign will be launched soon.

“Hopefully this is an effective, direct, old-school marketing campaign to remind our residents that when they are shopping to shop local,” she stated.

Many of the village’s commissions have not had formal meetings since March, when the stay-at-home order went into effect. Trustees believe it’s time for these groups to get back to work. They voted 6-0 to pass a resolution directing commissions to begin holding regular meetings — including public hearings — on Zoom.

Cauley said in-person meetings at village hall are always preferred.

“Unfortunately, it’s not going to happen soon and it may not happen for some time.”

Trustee Jerry Hughes suggested village board meetings be moved to Zoom as well and that commissions be asked to work through any backlog by the end of July.

One matter the parks and recreation commission needs to address in tandem with trustees is whether the Hinsdale Community Pool can open this summer. The Memorial Day opening has been delayed, and the village is waiting for guidance from the health department, Cauley said.

“We may ultimately end up canceling the pool for the year, but we’re holding off as long as we can.”



# No shortage of pomp for Central seniors

*Educators, parents have worked to find ways to celebrate members of the Class of 2020*

“Unfazed.”

That’s the title Hinsdale Central yearbook staffers choose — in September — for this year’s publication. How prophetic.

Members of the Class of 2020 have taken this unexpected season in stride, educators and parents say. And the adults in their lives have done their best to make the end of senior year special.

The “Let’s Celebrate Hinsdale District 86 Class of 2020” Facebook page created by Colleen Carroll, G’nee Andrulis and Polly Ascher recognizes seniors from Hinsdale Central and Hinsdale South high schools.

“Everybody posted their children and it just kind of snowballed,” said Carroll, whose oldest child is a freshman at South. “It’s great to see what everybody is doing. It’s great to see the achievements of these kids. There are some amazing kids in this class.”

Community members were invited to “adopt” a senior posted on the page and send them fan mail, cupcakes or a small gift.

“They’re not getting their proms. They’re not getting their graduations. It’s just something to let them know everyone is thinking about them and are proud of them,” Carroll said.

Molly Watcke, whose daughter Emma is a senior, said she wasn’t surprised to see how the community rallied around the students. The same thing happened when the family relocated here from Ohio last year.

“When we moved here in January of 2019 the people on the track and cross country team, the parents and the kids, they snatched our whole family up, not just my daughter,” she said. “It really made the whole move and transition pretty easy for her in particular.”

She has enjoyed reading posts about other seniors and learning where they will attend college.

“The other thing that has been kind of cool for me is people have replied to the post I made for my daughter,” she said.

The page is one of a number of virtual tributes to the senior class. Central’s counseling department sent out tweets with photos of seniors and their destinations this fall with the hashtag

#CollegeSigningDay. The activities department posted senior throwback photos of teachers with the message “We are thinking of the Class of 2020 every day!”

The Booster Club made sure the banners that usually hang around the fence during the graduation ceremony were available for people to hang on their doors or in their yard.

“We were collecting ideas from different places for the seniors to make it feel like a special graduation,” Booster Club board member Corey Huth said. “It is a special year — no one has ever been through this before.”

The names of each of the 678 graduates have been displayed on the digital sign on 55th Street, activities director Sally Phillip said, noting that Stefanie Hodermarksy, assistant to the principal, spent days typing them in by hand. Parents have

invested time to get a photo of their child’s name to post on Facebook.

“Parents have sat out there and waited,” Phillip said.

Seniors were invited back to school Monday and Tuesday this week for a drive-through pick up of their caps and gowns, diplomas and other items.

“I wish we could do more,” Principal Bill Walsh said. “Hopefully we’ll be able to do something this summer. At a minimum I’d love to get that stage up and have the kids walk across it in their cap and gown. Passing out diplomas in cars is not the same thing, not even close.”

Festivities will culminate tonight in a virtual graduation ceremony that last about an hour.

“I really think the virtual graduation is going to turn out really

## Turning back the clock

The class of 2020 lived through some major events since becoming high schoolers in August of 2016. Here are a few headlines that captured the nation’s attention:

### 2016

- Nov. 2 — The Chicago Cubs win the World Series for first time since 1908.
- Nov. 8 — Donald J. Trump is elected the nation’s 45th president.

### 2017

- Aug. 21 — The country was captivated by the first total solar eclipse to cross the U.S. since 1918.
- October — reports of film mogul Harvey Weinstein’s sexual misconduct give rise to the #MeToo movement and a cascade of allegations against prominent men taking advantage of women.
- Oct. 1 — a lone gunman fires from his Las Vegas hotel room into a crowd of concertgoers, killing 59 in the deadliest mass shooting in modern American history. Just over a month later, 26 people were killed by a gunman in a church in Sutherland Springs, Texas.

### 2018

- May 19 — England’s Prince Harry marries American actress Meghan Markle in a royal wedding that enthralled the world.
- Early July — Twelve members of a Thai boys soccer team and their coach were rescued from a flooded cave where they had been stranded for more than two weeks.
- Sept. 27 — Dr. Christine Blasey Ford gives testimony during the Senate Judiciary Committee hearings regarding her sexual assault allegations against Supreme Court nominee Brett Kavanaugh,

### 2019

- April 15 — The Notre Dame Cathedral in Paris is engulfed in flames that destroy the iconic spire and roof of the 850-year-old landmark.
- June 30 — President Donald Trump becomes the first sitting U.S. leader to set foot in North Korea while meeting North Korean leader Kim Jong Un at the Korean Demilitarized Zone
- July 24 — Former special counsel Robert Mueller testifies to Congress that Russia interfered in the 2016 presidential election but that his probe did not establish that members of the Trump campaign conspired with the Russian government to interfere.

### 2020

- Feb. 5 — President Trump is acquitted by the Senate after he had become the third president in US history to be impeached by the House of Representatives.
- March 13 — a national emergency is declared over the COVID-19 outbreak, triggering an extended shutdown of businesses, schools and churches across the country

## Man arrested for felony videotaping three girls

Jose L. Gaspar, 45, 2606 E. St. Charles Road, Bellwood, was arrested May 12 on a felony count of unauthorized videotaping and two felony counts of unauthorized videotaping of a person under 18 for taking photos and video recordings of girls at a house in the 5600 block of South Washington Street last year where he was performing construction work.

According to the DuPage County State's Attorney's Office, in November, Gaspar, standing outside the home, took dozens of photographs and video recordings of the homeowner's 15-year-old and 22-year-old daughters and another 16-year-old girl without their consent while they were showering. When Gaspar's acquaintances became aware of his actions, they alerted a family member

of the girls, who told the girls' father. He then contacted the Hinsdale Police Department.

"The allegations against Mr. Gaspar are extremely disturbing," said DuPage County State's Attorney Robert Berlin in a statement. "Fortunately, his alleged actions were uncovered and he now finds himself facing felony charges. I would like to thank the Hinsdale Police Department for their efforts during the investigation of Mr. Gaspar's alleged actions and for their continued effort in protecting the public. I would also like to thank Assistant State's Attorney Bridget Carlson for her work in securing charges against Mr. Gaspar."

Gaspar was taken to DuPage County Jail, and his bond was set at \$150,000. His next court appearance is scheduled for June 8.

## COVID-19 cases up slightly in Hinsdale

A total of 170 Hinsdale residents have confirmed cases of COVID-19 as of May 19, compared to 167 a week ago.

The DuPage County Health Department reported 160 confirmed cases in Hinsdale and the Cook County Health Department reported 10 confirmed cases in the village.

A total of 163 confirmed cases and 24 deaths are associated with ManorCare in Hinsdale, according to the Illinois Department of Public Health. Those numbers include residents and staff who might not be DuPage County residents.

Amita Hinsdale Hospital had 21 confirmed COVID-19 patients and 15 patients awaiting test results on Tuesday, a spokeswoman said.

DuPage County has a total of 6,172 confirmed cases, including 314 deaths, up from 5,117 cases and 259 deaths a week ago.

A total of 1,006 cases in DuPage, including 196 deaths, are related to long-term care facilities in the county.



You are extraordinary young men and women, scholars and athletes, musicians and actors, leaders and philanthropists. You will, as the former president noted, continue to make us proud. And you will have a lifetime of accomplishments to celebrate.


Dawn is preceded in death by her husband Frederick Potts McIntyre; and her daughter, Pamela Apsley McIntyre.

## KOSHGARIAN RUG CLEANERS

As the rain continued to fall Sunday night, Jordan Koshgarian's phone continued to ring. Peoples' homes had water where it didn't belong, and they knew to turn to the century-old local business for help.

"They want to get their basements cleaned out and dried out," said Koshgarian, vice president of Koshgarian Rug Cleaners Inc. of Hinsdale.

Along with the rug cleaning services that remain at the heart of the family-owned business, water restoration is one in an array of professional cleaning services now offered by the Hinsdale company.

Koshgarian's great-grandfather started the business now known as Koshgarian Rug Cleaners Inc. in La Grange in 1906. As the family story goes, Mihron wanted to sell rugs, but his wife Mary saw the potential in cleaning the rugs that people already had in their homes.

"Rug cleaning is still the heart and soul of the business," said Koshgarian, the fourth generation to work in the family-owned company. He and his father, Chuck, lead a staff of 16 carefully selected professionals trained to carry on the company's commitment to quality.

While other cleaning methods make a rug look clean, Koshgarian said their method ensures a rug that's clean from fringe to floor. Machines now help to move the process along, Koshgarian said, but today's staff takes the same care his great-grandfather took to ensure every rug comes out thoroughly cleaned and without damage.

"We're hands on," Koshgarian said.

Every cleaning job is inspected for quality before the rug is moved to the company's heated drying room. After four to six hours in the 140-degree room, the rug is ready to once again add warmth, color and character to the owner's home.

Koshgarian said the cleaning method is safe for all rugs, from inexpensive synthetic rugs bought at a department store to valuable imports and antiques.

How often a rug needs professional cleaning depends on how much traffic it gets, but a good rule of thumb is every one to two years, Koshgarian said.

"If it's getting walked on, it's a good idea to get it cleaned," he said.

The experts at Koshgarian also can repair and restore rugs. They'll

even pick up and deliver.

After getting its start in La Grange, Koshgarian Rug Cleaners moved to its current home at 248 East Ogden in Hinsdale in the 1950s. When wall-to-wall carpet came into fashion in the 1960s, in-home carpet cleaning was added to the company's repertoire of services.

In the decades to come, Koshgarian Rug Cleaners would further diversify by adding tile, grout, hardwood and upholstery cleaning.

Koshgarian said every member of the Koshgarian team is trained in every service offered. Before a technician enters a home, he or she is certified by the Institute of Restoration and Cleaning.

Deemed an essential service, business has remained steady, if not busy, throughout the COVID-19 shutdown.

Masks, gloves and shoe covers are now standard work attire for everyone who enters a customer's home. Equipment is disinfected between each job.

"We're ensuring our customers are going to be safe," Koshgarian said — and as always, that their homes are going to be clean.



## Red Devils' graduation goes on

*Hinsdale Central seniors will mark high schools' end with virtual ceremony*

Today is graduation day at Hinsdale Central High School, and it will be a student send-off like never before.

The ceremony already has been digitally recorded and will be watched tonight by the 678 graduating seniors alongside family at home instead of shoulder-to-shoulder with classmates on Dickinson Field.

Central's assistant principal, Ryan Maita, said the design for today's virtual graduation ceremony began coalescing about a month ago.

"I think we started planning as soon as the restriction guidelines came out from the governor's office regarding the shelter-in-place through May," he said. "We didn't want to lose the (graduation) day of May 21. We wanted to honor our kids on this day."

That was the clear consensus expressed by students and families, for whom the notion of postponing the ceremony until some mid-summer date garnered little support.

"We met with a lot of different student groups and put out a survey on things they wanted," Maita said. "Their lives have been turned upside down, and we wanted to make sure they had a part in this."

He also met with Blake Trchka, Central grad and co-owner of Perfect Show Productions, which has been directing the school's graduations since 2008.

Trchka said the idea of a virtual ceremony was a departure from the norm but not outside his wheelhouse.

"We're familiar with the cadence and the important aspects of the ceremony for the school," Trchka said. "When the administration contacted us and was looking to move to a virtual format, we worked with them as much as possible to maintain the same feel as it was in person but in a digital format."

Essentially the occasion would need to be packaged both verbally and graphically.

"Behind the scenes we had to put together a Power Point that mirrored what we do in a normal setting," Trchka explained. "I'm very grateful for the tools that we have available, like HD cameras and non-

linear editing software, to make this possible."

The school's guidance department gathered information for student slides, making sure names were matched with any awards received.

On May 11 in the gymnasium, Trchka and his crew filmed the ceremony, including the address by senior Kayleigh Excell, a role she'd envisioned since beginning her Red Devil journey.

"I just got my letter from freshman year back in which we wrote a list of accomplishments we hoped for," she said. "One of them was to be the graduation speaker. It was just a reminder of all the hard work that went into this (moment)."

A Zoom audition last month helped prepare her for the unorthodox nature of this year's ceremony. Although a seasoned public speaker through her forensics team involvement, she is used to feeding off the reactions of her audience.

Thankfully she wasn't alone at the taping.

"There were a couple people there who are involved in the ceremony who I could get a reaction

from. That definitely made it less awkward," Excell said.

She said her theme of class unity amidst changing circumstances would have been the same if given in person. Having to deliver it more than a week ahead of time, however, required some adjustments.

"I had an AP test that day, so I had to go home and curl my hair and get dressed. It was kind of a hectic day," she remarked.

Excell admitted her forensics habits surfaced when she nodded at the cameraman at the end of her address as she would to a judge at a competition. She sees a silver lining in the digital creation.

"I can re-watch it as much as I want," she said.

Maita said he's felt some anxiety concerning the students' slides, which he's checked and double-checked for typos.

"You don't want to misspell their name," he said. "We're picking through them with a fine-tooth comb."

Faculty name readers usually are able to clarify any name confusion with students ahead of time. Remote learning hindered that this

year, but doing it on video affords lots of do-overs.

Trchka said the post-production editing has taken time, from deleting unwelcome background noise to splicing out verbal slips. He estimated spending at least 35 hours on this project versus 20 to 22 hours in a regular year.

He's also incorporating a senior memories video and virtual performances of the National Anthem by the Central choir and "Pomp and Circumstance" by the Central band.

"It's just such a nice touch. You can still see the students perform. Over 200 students are participating virtually," Trchka said. "I'm really happy with how everything came together. I definitely think that this virtual ceremony showcases the best of the students."

Maita said he aimed to provide a commencement students could be proud of.

"My hope is that we give some joy to these seniors. We really wanted to put a smile on their faces and give them the recognition that they deserve," Maita said. "Hopefully this gives them something to remember."

## Grieving our normal lives during the coronavirus

We are experiencing the loss of our schedules, routines and typical relationships. Some of us are grieving the loss of security and sense of safety.

The idea of grieving our normal lives and routines may seem unfair given the thousands of people who have contracted COVID-19, the individuals who have died from the virus and countless others working in the medical field to save the lives of these individuals.

It is important to grant ourselves grace by recognizing that although you may not have lost as much as others, your loss is still significant. Your loss still matters. It is OK to grieve what you have lost.

Children are especially vulnerable to this grief. Their limited ability to recognize and process the current pandemic impacts their ability to understand why this is happening.

Children certainly see how the pandemic is impacting them, though. They are not attending school, they can't play at the park, and they are unable to see their friends and extended family.

Let your children know that it is OK to feel sad about these losses. It is OK for them to cry because they miss their friends or miss hugs from their grandparents. Then give yourself that same grace.

Give yourself permission to think about what you have lost since the pandemic began. Perhaps you have had to cancel vacations, trips or other plans. You probably have not been able to continue your regular routine. It is likely your relationships have changed, including who you

spend your time with and how you spend your time with them.

Give yourself permission to cry if you feel the need. Then, recognize the areas of your life that have continued or even improved since the pandemic began.

Perhaps you really enjoy virtual visits with your parents. Maybe you love your daily walks around the neighborhood. You may be enjoying spending more time with your family, reading, trying out new recipes or simply the slower pace of life right now.

Find time to enjoy the new pleasures in your life while also recognizing the losses you have experienced.




Average Sales Price\*



### Are Therapy Dogs Tax Deductible?

**DEAR PAW'S CORNER:** I spend quite a bit of money each year on my two Corgis: veterinary care, grooming, toys and a pet sitter. They're also registered as therapy pets — so they earn their keep! With all that I spend, why can't I write off pet care on my taxes? — *Harold in Palo Alto, California*

**DEAR HAROLD:** I hear you! Americans spent almost \$96 billion on their pets in 2019, over \$5 billion more than they did in 2018. But almost none of that can be deducted from federal taxes. Here's what you can't deduct: medical expenses, training or maintenance (like grooming and pet sitters). Companion or comfort animals and many therapy pets aren't eligible for tax deductions.

Here are the few deductions that are possible:

- If you have a service animal — one that is trained to assist those with specific medical conditions, such as a guide dog for the blind or a service dog that assists those with mobility or neurological issues — the costs of buying, training and maintaining that service animal may be deductible.

- If an animal is employed at your business — such as a guard dog or the star of your Instagram empire — you may be able to take a deduction on your business taxes. But be prepared to explain how the pet is essential to your business.

- If you donate money or goods to a registered nonprofit animal shelter or animal advocacy group, this counts as a charitable deduction. Make sure to get a receipt.

- Finally, you can set up a trust fund to care for your pets should they outlive you. Talk to an estate attorney about this option and any potential tax benefits.



## State competitions made headlines


*Look back at spring sports coverage highlights success of many programs at Central*


