# D86 HR head resigns day after meeting

Cheryl Moore has resigned as assistant superintendent of human resources in Hinsdale High School District 86, effective Friday, April

Moore confirmed she had resigned after The Hinsdalean saw her position posted on the District 86 website.

"I'm not really commenting any further than to confirm what I shared with you," she replied when asked if she had obtained another position.

Moore also declined to comment when asked if her decision had anything to do with the March 21 board meeting, at which board member and administrators had a heated discussion about staffing recommendations.

"Better not comment," she said. She did confirm that her resignation letter was dated March 22.

At that meeting, administra-

tors came under fire from board members for the way they handled changes to the course schedule the board had requested at the previous meeting March 14. Board members said they were surprised early bird PE had been offered to all students and not just music students and were disappointed that not all freshmen were informed that honors biology would be running at South in the fall, even though it had not been offered previous years. When board President Cat Greenspon suggested postponing a vote on the staffing plan, Moore requested an open-ended vote that would allow the board to add more staff at an April meeting. Greenspon's next action was to make a motion to postpone the vote until April 11. It did not pass, and ultimately a staffing plan with 1.8 additional full-time equivalents was approved. Board members encouraged request for more staff if needed for the HAVEN program.

"The forecast does not include

any of this," Moore noted at the meeting. "As you continue to add, the financial aspect also needs to be considered."

On the next agenda items, the non-renewal of two probationary full-time teachers, board member Peggy James asked if the decision to add 1.8 FTE had any affect on these two individuals.

"That wouldn't impact it in any way," Moore said from her seat at the back of the board room. "These are just people who will not be invited back. So if the positions still exist then we would fill the positions."

"Wait, Cheryl Moore," Greenspon said, interrupting her, and the two had some additional back and forth.

"My question to you is why don't you come up and hear the question before you make a decision?" Greenspon said. "That would be appropriate. Thank you."

Greenspon asked Moore whether the decision to add staff would affect agenda items 4.7, 4.8 and 4.9.


"We would not know that. You are the only one who would know that, Cheryl," Greenspon said.

"I really am not comfortable having this conversation in open because there are individuals attached to these resolutions," she said, with Greenspon interjecting comments like "OK" and "thank you" while Moore spoke.

Ultimately the board voted to table the items until April 11.

District 86, in a statement provided upon request, said it is grateful for Moore's service over the past three years.

"She has been a valuable member of our leadership team and played a vital role in attracting and welcoming in quality teachers, related services staff, support staff, coaches and administrators," the statement read. "While we are saddened to see her leave, we understand and respect her decision to pursue a new opportunity and wish her nothing but the best moving forward."

# Hinsdale gets ready for the solar eclipse

Next week's arrival of rare cosmic event generates curiosity, excitement among residents

So have you heard about the solar eclipse happening on Monday?

The answer is likely yes, given the level of attention it is commanding. And rightfully so, as the moon's shadow will sweep from Texas to Maine on April 8 in an event not to happen again in the U.S. until 2044. And the Chicago area lies in close proximity to the "path of totality," prompting many to trek to southern Illinois or neighboring Indiana to experience it.

Alan McCloud, Hinsdale Central earth science teacher, said the eclipse will take about two and a half hours from start to finish, or from around 12:50 to 3:20 p.m. locally, and be at its max at about 2:08 p.m.

"It happens as the moon gradually passes in front of the sun, and as they are about the same size in the sky from our perspective," McCloud explained, noting the sun is 400 times larger than the moon but 400 times farther away. "The moon nearly perfectly fits over the sun when everything lines up correctly."

Hinsdale won't go dusk-like as in regions within the path of totality, but with an estimated 94-percent sun coverage, "the sky will darken gradually until the middle of the eclipse, then gradually lighten," he said.

Even with just a sliver of sun showing, eclipse watchers will need special glasses for protection.

That amount of direct sunlight from the surface of the sun is still enough to do permanent damage to one's eyes," McCloud cautioned, suggesting a pinhole camera as an alternative.

The Hinsdale Public Library has been giving away solar filter eclipse glasses over the last few weeks, one per household, to library cardholders who register. The library has also partnered with the District 181 Foundation to provide glasses for students in grades three through eight so they can safely participate.

### **Hinsdale Village Board**

Among other business at their meeting Tuesday, trustees:

- recognized Fire Chief John Giannelli, who is retiring tomorrow, April 5, after 32 years of service with the village. He joined the fire department in 1991 as a full-time firefighter. He was promoted to lieutenant in 2006, captain in 2012 and chief in 2016.
- awarded a construction contract to Schroeder Asphalt Services in an amount not to exceed \$653,212 for the 2024 asphalt resurfacing program. Work will be done on Monroe Street from Sixth to Eighth, Fifth Street from Lincoln to Garfield, Quincy Street from North to Hickory, Bodin St. from south of Eighth to north of Ninth and the Veeck Park parking lot.
- approved an major adjustment to the exterior appearance and site plan for the new Normandy Remodeling location at 222 E. Ogden Ave. to allow changes to the rooftop mechanical unit screening. The applicant wants to change from one to three screened areas, with a reduced height of the panels.
- agreed to approve a temporary use permit and indemnification agreement to allow for outdoor seating through Oct. 31 at Casa Margarita, 25 E. Hinsdale Ave. Trustee plan to take an official vote at their April 16 meeting.

# New steps added to preservation process

# Changes designed to encourage renovation of historic homes, but nothing new is binding

Hinsdale will have a new Ad Hoc Historic District Design Review team in the next two weeks.

Trustees voted unanimously Tuesday to amend sections of the Hinsdale Village Code to create the new entity and make other changes to the historic preservation process.

"The process is designed to encourage owners of historic homes to preserve their homes," Village President Tom Cauley told The Hinsdalean Wednesday. "But if a historic home is to be demolished, we want to encourage homeowners to build a new home that is consistent with the historic nature of the Robbins Historic District.

"But at the end of the process — which will be completed in a reasonable length of time — homeowners can do what they want with their properties, no matter what the HPC (historic preservation commission) and board may decide," he added.

"This process is designed to encourage, not to strong-arm homeowners or to dictate what they can do with their properties."

Up to this point, property owners who wanted to demolish a home in the Robbins Park Historic District or at other landmarked sites had to appear before the historic preservation commission to receive a certificate of appropriateness for new construction before demolition could occur. In the past, if the commission denied the certificate, homeowners were free to proceed how they wished.

Under the new ordinance, property owners must file a preliminary application and meet with the new design review team before applying for a certificate of appropriateness with the preservation commission. This step is required for property owners seeking the demolition, relocation or removal of an existing residence or the construction of a new residence within the Robbins Park Historic District and for all changes to

landmarked properties regardless of location, according to a memo from village attorney Michael Marrs.

The review team will provide design feedback, education, guidance and advice to property owners, with written recommendations required within 15 days of the meeting. It also may require the applicant to prepare a Historic and Architectural Impact Study as part of the subsequent application for a certificate of appropriateness

That study has a capped cost of \$250 and need not provide more than the information available from the Hinsdale Historical Society "or other readily available sources," according to the memo.

The review team, which Cauley must appoint by April 17, is likely to include Trustee Alexis Braden, a former member of the historic preservation commission. Another member will come from the preservation commission, and Cauley said he will let the HPC chair choose that individual. The ordinance indicates the team

could have three or more members.

"I have no one in mind for the third member. Indeed, we may not have a third member," Cauley said.


The changes approved Tuesday night include other provisions as well.

Homeowners who are denied a certificate of appropriateness by the preservation commission will be required to attend a Hinsdale Village Board meeting for additional input and a vote. That meeting must take place within 60 days of the preservation commission's vote.

Demolition fees will increase from \$7,928 to \$11,100 for homes within the Robbins Park Historic District to help defray the cost of staff and consultant time.

Trustees discussed the ordinance during a first read at their March 13 meeting. Since that time, the process was shortened by two months.

"We don't want the process to be so long that it adversely affects homeowners' rights to make decisions regarding their properties," Cauley

# New initiative targets distracted drivers

Hinsdale Police Department is partnering with the Illinois Department of Transportation, Illinois State Police and more than 200 local law enforcement agencies to step up enforcement efforts across the state in recognition of Distracted Driving Awareness Month. Throughout April, motorists can expect increased patrols looking for texting and driving as well as other traffic violations with the "U Drive. U Text. U Pay." campaign.

"Distracted driving is one of the leading causes of motor vehicle crashes on our roads today," Deputy Chief Thomas Lillie said. "During Distracted Driving Awareness Month, law enforcement will boost enforcement efforts, stopping

anyone we see texting and driving. We do this to save lives."

Between 2012 and 2021, approximately 32,000 lives were lost in crashes involving distracted drivers. Everyone has the potential for distracted driving crashes, but those between the ages of 16 and 24 are especially at risk. A driver who needs to text should pull over to a safe location, or if there is a passenger, consider appointing a "designated texter." Whatever the solution, don't text and drive.

In Illinois, using a phone in anything other than hands-free mode is not only dangerous, but also illegal.

The Illinois distracted driving campaign is funded with federal traffic safety funds administered by IDOT.

# Fostering cats purr-fect for mom/daughter duo

When the Lohans first moved into their Hinsdale home, they discovered some unexpected neighbors: feral cats.

"Then two years ago, one of these cats had kittens under our air conditioner," Amy Lohan said. "I called the Hinsdale Humane Society and said, 'What do I do?'"

The lifelong dog lover and cat allergy sufferer was not exactly receptive to the humane society's suggestion that the family foster the two kittens.

"I was like, 'Absolutely not. I have a dog, I don't know what to do with cats,' " she related.

Their daughter Emily, now 7, was keen on the fostering notion, however. So Amy explored it further.

"(Humane society staff) told me what to do to capture the two kittens to bring them in and to try to catch the mom," she said. "We kind of talked through what would fostering even entail."

Those interested in learning more about fostering adoptable cats or dogs can are invited to the humane society's Foster Orientation Fair from noon to 1:30 p.m. this Saturday, April 6, at the shelter (see Page 22 for details).

Amy was told she needed a bathroom in which to keep them, and to feed them and "give 'em some loving."

"It took a while to catch them both. The mama was on to me, and I saw her early in the morning carrying them by their neck to the yard behind us," Amy said. "We did foster those kittens, and we loved it. It was so fun."

The kittens primarily stayed in their basement bathroom quarters to avoid interaction with resident dog Cooper.

"I was surprised how easy it was and how fun it was to play with kittens," she said.

The kittens were ultimately adopted by others. Mama cat, meanwhile, was "TNR-ed" — trap, neuter and release — with the help of the Lohans.

"We've probably done TNR for, minimum, at least 10 cats," she said, noting the process which helps curtail additional neighborhood litters.

"We have not seen any new kittens here in probably about a year and a half," Amy reported.

Their fostering journey continued, with the family hosting as many as five kittens at one time.

"It wasn't a whole lot more work, really. It was more try-

ing to keep five kittens in a bathroom and get out without them all running out," she said.

A trial run at puppy fostering proved more labor intensive, but Emily said they have affection for both animals.

"We love dogs and cats the same," Emily said.

Amy praised shelter staff and foster manager Carla Wudi in particular for their support.

"They provide everything that you need: a bed, litter box, food, toys, blanket, carrier," Amy said. "It's only usually a short commitment of time because kittens are ready for neutering (after six weeks)."

Emily enjoys discussing the fostering experience with her school classmates, and her friends like playing with their current foster kitten, Cookies and Cream.

Amy laments steering clear of felines for so many years.

"It brings me so much joy," Amy said, acknowledging that she does receive allergy shots. "I can't believe I missed out on having a cat my whole life.

"I would foster more if I had more space," she added.

# Avoid the stress of the season with healthy habits

The arrival of spring for many ushers in a rising level of activities, obligations — and stress.

April is National Stress Awareness Month to bring attention to the negative impact of stress. The National Institutes of Health want people to recognize that managing stress is an essential component of a healthy lifestyle — and that knowing how to manage stress can improve mental and physical well-being as well as minimize exacerbation of health-related issues.

Mental Health America provides a Stress Screener (www.mhanational.org/get-involved/stress-screener) to help people better understand ways for reducing stress. And the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention offers these strategies for cultivating a calmer mental state:

- Take a break from the news, including social media. It's good to be informed, but constant information about negative events can be upsetting.
- Staying physically healthy can improve one's emotional well-being. Eat healthy and get enough sleep: seven or more hours per night is recommended for adults.

- Move more and sit less. Start small and build up to 20 to 30 minutes a day of exercise.
- Limit alcohol intake. When choosing to drink, men should stop at two servings and women should stop at one.
- Don't smoke, vape or use other tobacco products.
- Continue with regular health appointments, tests, screenings and vaccinations.
- Make time to unwind, and take deep breaths, stretch or meditate.
- Connect with others, and talk with trusted people about concerns and feelings.

Hinsdale and the surrounding area have a variety of resources to assist in stress management, including a number of gyms for both mind and body fitness, or natural areas like Fullersburg Woods to find healing in the great outdoors.

The Community House, 415 W. Eighth St., invites people to register for the following upcoming programs as methods for coping with stress. Visit www.thecommunityhouse.org.

• The six-week Tai Chi beginners course will be held from 10:45 to 11:30 a.m. Fridays, April 12 to

May 24 (no class April 19).

Often described as "meditation in motion," the mind-body practice of Tai Chi has shown value in treating or preventing many health problems through its slow, gentle movements and physical postures, meditative state of mind and controlled breathing. It's a low-impact, slow-motion exercise that doesn't put any pressure on the joints. Practitioners see improved balance and coordination, and those suffering chronic health conditions have found it therapeutic.

The course cost is \$115 with a \$15 discount for members.

• The Mindfulness Meditation 4-Week Workshop from 1 to 1:50 p.m. every Thursday from May 2 to 23 is designed to train participants' minds the way one trains the body for the perfect antidote to daily stress. Chopra Center certified meditation instructor Stephanie Frantz will teach centuries-old meditation and breathing techniques to relieve stress and increase an overall sense of well-being. Each session will be elevated to build on the techniques learned.

The cost is \$97, \$85 for members.

# Honesty is (almost) always the best policy

I'll never forget the day I went in to meet with Ainsley's fifth-grade teacher at the start of the school year. The teacher asked if I had anything I wished to share, and I provided what I believed to be an honest assessment of my then 10-year-old daughter.

"Wow. That was really grounded," she replied.

I was surprised. I wondered if she meant that I was an exceptionally observant parent who had offered a particularly accurate portrait of her child. But I think what she really meant was that I didn't sugarcoat the truth.

The older I get, the more and more comfortable I am with telling the truth, the whole truth and nothing but the truth.

Don't get me wrong. I will continue to tell white lies when asked about an insignificant matter (like whether I like my friend's new purse) could cause a breach in a relationship.

And I will not divulge information to individuals who have no business

knowing it, even when pressed.

But in most other circumstances, I find being honest is the easiest and most effective way to get through life.

First of all, avoiding the truth almost always has consequences, even if they are not immediate. Remember all those celebrity parents who paid big bucks to falsify their

big bucks to falsify their kids' SAT scores so they could get into more prestigious colleges?

They got caught, of course, but I think the attempted falsehood did even more damage to their kids. Telling a teen that you don't think she is good enough to make it without lying, without your help, isn't going to give her the promising future you thought you were purchasing

Most lies eventually come back to haunt you, often in ways you did not anticipate.

Second, there is the problem of

keeping track of the false-hoods you've presented. If I tell a true story to one friend and an adapted version to another, I have to remember which one knows what. And if I tell multiple lies to the same person, I have to make sure I don't contradict myself.

As Mark Twain said, "If you tell the truth, you don't have to remember

anything."

Finally, and I believe most importantly, the truth will set you free, as first pointed out by Jesus thousands of years ago.

I like Gloria Steinem's take on the phrase as well — "But first it will piss you off!" And I think that's where most of us — or at least I — get hung up. There's a reason it's referred to as "the cold, hard truth." The truth is often unpleasant. It can reveal shortcomings in our personal relationships, in our professional lives and in ourselves. If we pay attention

to the truth, we might realize that we aren't doing all we can to be a good parent, spouse, friend or co-worker.

But accepting the truth is the first step to making changes. When we hide from the truth, we also obscure solutions to the problems we are facing. Only with awareness and acceptance can be we prepared to take action to, as the serenity prayer says, change the things we can. And there will always be those things we cannot change.

The truth is not always as unwelcome as this column may suggest. There are glorious truths we encounter that are cause for true celebration.

To read others' reflections on the truth — and there are many — just do a quick Google search of "truth quotes." I'll close with one of my favorites, from Oprah Winfrey: "What I know for sure is that speaking your truth is the most powerful tool we have."

# It happened on a Metra train

A few weeks ago, I had an appointment in the city and decided to take my preschool-aged daughter along for a girls' day out.

We had a wonderful day planned, and we dressed for the occasion, in dresses and fancy shoes. We decided to take the train to make the day even more special. I had packed snacks and books and stickers,

as I know all too well that a special day can go south if your young date becomes hungry or bored. The train was a bit full, so we couldn't sit on top as we'd hoped, but were happy as we settled in for our adventure.

As I said, the train was crowded, the commuters dourly looking straight ahead or at their cell phones or newspapers. There were women and men of all ages and ethnicities in our car, but the overall feeling was one of sameness and monotony. But amidst so many suburban workers heading to the city, one woman was clearly different.

The woman was seated with her young daughter and several overstuffed suitcases. She spoke loudly on her cell phone, bemoaning the family member who had failed to pick her up to drive her to the city.

Her language was colorful; she was angry. Her daughter squirmed and cried out of boredom or lack of attention.

The commuters around her became more dour, more insulated in their personal space, and purposely ignored the loud woman, or rarely cast dirty looks her way. The train conductor approached the woman and threatened her, which made her more volatile.

My daughter was fascinated and a bit afraid of the woman and her daughter. The commotion was unsettling. We sank a bit deeper in our seats. I protectively wrapped my arm around my little girl, and we read our book. When my daughter asked for a snack, I opened a package

of cookies. Then, I asked my daughter if she'd like to offer a cookie to the daughter of the disruptive woman.

Without a second thought, my daughter reached for the cookie and approached the woman and her daughter. She extended her arm, cookie in hand, and asked the little girl if she'd like it.

The contrast could not have been more dramatic. My little girl in her fancy dress for a special day with her mama, the other girl shabbily clothed and largely ignored despite her cries. The other mother looked at me and quietly asked her child if she'd like a cookie, and the girl accepted.

The train car became ... peaceful. The mom stopped talking and visibly relaxed. The little girl ate her cookie quietly. The commuters were stunned out of their glum isolation. They looked at my sweet daughter, and at me, and smiled. Then they actually looked at the loud woman and her daughter. And smiled. She was no longer the villain. Instead she could be seen for what she was: an unfortunate woman in a difficult situation, struggling with sad circumstances.

I believe life-changing events can be both grand and small. On that short train ride, I learned about the power of kindness. It can be contagious, it can permeate, it can create a movement every bit as powerful as hatred and indifference.

When the train reached Union Station, I offered to help the woman with her bags and she gratefully accepted. Before I could help, though, a businessman offered to escort the woman and her daughter off the train and grabbed the large suitcases. I simply held my own daughter's hand and we walked off the train into our special day.

### Don't use taxpayer money for incentives

The Historic Preservation Commission has been involved in generating grants and tax abatements to assist in the financing and construction of additions to homes on the Historically Significant Structures Property List. The HPC and the trustees are subsidizing the improvements to private homes with taxpayer money.

President Cauley has said that the owners needed "incentives" to undertake these improvements. During a recent HPC meeting, a proposed new home to be built in the historic district was discussed. The HPC did not give the new property a certificate of appropriateness. The new owners had abided by all the rules of the village to obtain permission for this new construction. The new home design came under extreme criticism by the head of the HPC and its members. Terms

like NIMBY and "Screw the neighborhood attitude" were voiced at this meeting toward the new owners.

I have done volunteer work on Oak Park's annual "Wright Plus" house walks, where I learned about their 10-member historic commission. They work with homeowners who are interested in the restoration/preservation of their homes. No financial support is available from Oak Park for these improvements. Oak Park has avoided the questionable practice of granting taxpayer-funded cash and benefits from one set of neighbors to another set of neighbors. At a recent meeting of the Hinsdale Board of Trustees, I asked the trustees to stop using taxpayer money for private home improvements and to rein in the obnoxious treatment by the HPC of residents wanting to build new homes. - Robert A. Lennox Jr., Hinsdale

# **ASK AN EXPERT**

# What are the keys to foot and ankle health?

With the return of spring come April showers, May flowers and an uptick in injuries as people emerge from their winter habits. Ashley Lee, podiatrist at Northern Illinois Foot and Ankle Specialists' Hinsdale office, said the return to activities like pickleball, tennis, running, walking and youth sports results in an increase in visits to her office for treatment of sports-related injuries.

The surging popularity of pickle-ball has resulted in more patients suffering from injuries such as tendonitis, especially involving the Achilles tendon, Lee said. Also known as Achilles tendonitis, symptoms include stiffness on the back of the heel and lower leg after sitting. The feeling generally subsides during rest, but returns when activity resumes.

"It's caused by excessive stress on the Achilles tendon," Lee said, and is often caused by the short, rapid movements required of not only pickleball, but of tennis and paddle ball, as well.

Stretching before and after activity can help to prevent the injury, Lee said. She also recommends wearing the right shoes. Shoes designated for use on the court offer the stability needed for sudden movements and offer better protection from injury, she said.

Pain in the ball of the foot also can result from time spent on the pick-leball or tennis court. The frequent pivoting required of the sports can result in metatarsalgia, or inflammation in the long bones in the front of the feet.

Initial treatments include rest, ice and elevation. But when those remedies don't work and the pain persists, a trip to the podiatrist might be in order, Lee said. Treatments might include shockwave therapy. Originally developed for treatment of kidney stones, shockwave is now being used to treat many injuries involving soft tissue, Lee said.

Before hitting the walking or running path, Lee suggests that runners make a trip to their closet.

"How old are your shoes?" Lee asked, stating that any shoe that shows signs of wear should be replaced. Even shoes that haven't been worn should be replaced within a year, as materials degrade even

in storage, Lee said. She suggests starting a new season of walking or running with a new pair of shoes designed specifically for the activity.

As with pickleball and tennis, injuries of the Achilles tendon are common with runners and walkers. These activities also can cause conditions such as plantar fasciitis and shin splints.

"Stretching is the treatment for all of this," said Lee, emphasizing the importance of stretching before and after any activity.

Something as simple as alternating the side of the street for walks and runs also can help prevent injury. Lee said even a slight slope can cause stress and strain on one side of the body. Running on the center of the track or road, or frequently changing sides, can help reduce the risk of injury.

Along with stretching and wearing the proper shoes, Lee said getting enough vitamin D is important to keep bones healthy. Most people are deficient, she said, especially coming out of winter. And it's difficult to get enough of the vitamin through food. She suggests getting levels checked by a doctor and proceeding with a supplement, if necessary.



# Chicago chamber group visits town

Camerata chamber orchestra offers classical favorites at Hinsdale concert

The celebrated sounds of the Camerata Chicago Orchestra will serenade Hinsdale in a performance commemorating the group's 20th anniversary season.

The chamber orchestra will present its concert at 3 p.m. Sunday, April 14, at the Hinsdale Seventhday Adventist Church, with a program including Dvorak's "New World Symphony" and Rossini's "William Tell Overture" and guest pianist Marta Aznavoorian performing Beethoven's Piano Concerto No. 3.

Music director Drostan Hall was compelled to found Camerata in 2003 after he was invited to conduct Handel's "Messiah" at a Chicago church.

"While I was studying the score for that sacred work, the idea came to me: 'Let's start a chamber orchestra,' " recounted Hall, whose lineage includes Sir Charles Mackerras, the British conductor who opened the Sydney Opera House in 1973.

Two decades later, the group has grown from 14 string musicians to 55 instrumentalists, boasting international acclaim.

The daughters of Hinsdale residents Tatjana and Nikola Nenadovich studied violin with Hall, and in 2020 the idea emerged to organize a Camerata concert to raise money for children in orphanages throughout Serbia and other former Yugoslavian nations. The pandemic postponed the plan, but Tatjana, a member of Camerata's Ladies Guild, facilitated a program in Chicago last October featuring renowned Serbian violinist Stefan Milenkovich. Crown Prince Alexander and Crown Princess Katherine of Serbia even flew in to attend.

"All the stars aligned perfectly with the orchestra's 20th anniversary," Tatjana said.

Hall said Hinsdale became a natural finale on a three-day suburban tour, preceded by stops in Evanston on April 12 and Wheaton on April 13. He is excited to give local residents access to high-quality classical music close to home.

"I wanted to make it a very spe-

cial concert," he said. "I wanted it to be very friendly for families and children because it's very important for us that children are welcome to come to our programs."

The well-known "New World Symphony" was written by Dvorak when he first came to the U.S. in 1892. It was also a gamechanger for Hall when he heard it live as a boy.

"It was simply the most thrilling experience of my young life. This performance was full of wonderful tunes and it just changed my life. I decided that I would become a musician because I was so moved," he related, describing symphony as "infused with the American spirit" with both African-American and Native American influences.

The "William Tell Overture" became a household anthem in the States serving as the theme song for TV's popular "The Lone Ranger" series.

"That catapulted it to worldwide fame. And it has that wonderful fanfare of trumpets," Hall said.

Chicago's Aznavoorian, who also performs with the Lincoln Trio and teaches piano at DePaul University, among other endeavors, said the Beethoven composition is a particular favorite.

"I am looking forward to revisiting this old friend of mine. I love this piece and feel a close connection to it. It's got drama, it's playful, it's philosophical and heroic — everything compelling about Beethoven," she said. "I am honored to by performing with this excellent orchestra under the bold leadership of Maestro Drostan Hall.

"We urge you to bring the whole family," Aznavoorian underscored. "We don't bite."

Hall said Camerata gets frequent play on WFMT, but that nothing compares to live listening. He praised the Seventh-day Adventist Church as a stellar venue.

"It's a great location with great acoustics. A church often has a richer sound and is so much more reverberant than other places," he said. "I think it's important that classical music is provided locally for families. It's a hop, skip and jump from their homes, and they can come and enjoy world-class music

# A tasty solution to the great dinner dilemma

Aretha Franklin was once asked what her greatest creative challenge was and her answer was surprising.

"Trying to figure out what to cook for dinner... nightly."

The interviewer, Larry London, paused and laughed. Her honesty was refreshing

and at the same time endearing because it made you realize that even the queen of soul had to think about dinner.

That's the problem with dinner; it's so nightly. Even if you love to cook it's easy to hit a

creative challenge when planning so many meals. We


all have a those five to 10 recipes that we tend to make again and again. That's why I'm always looking for new dinner ideas. Sometimes I find it in a cook book, newspaper article or blog.

However, the inspiration for this apricot and thyme chicken came from a magazine story about a roasted leg of lamb with apricots and thyme, which sounded wonderful. However, it wasn't a dish I could easily make on a weeknight. So, I decided to create a French inspired chicken with the same apricot and thyme flavors. This chicken has a delicious pan sauce with shallots, white wine and a touch of cream. I love to serve it with wild rice and roasted asparagus.

This elegant but easy dinner can be made in 30 minutes. It's one of those dishes that's fun to make because it tastes like you stepped out to dinner at a French bistro, only you don't have to travel far. So, if you are looking for a little dinner inspiration then I have a recipe that hits all the right notes for a delicious weeknight dinner — my apricot thyme chicken.

### Chicken with apricots and thyme



- 4 boneless skinless chicken breasts
- 1 teaspoon kosher salt
- 1/8 teaspoon pepper
- 2 tablespoons of olive oil
- 1 tablespoon butter
- 1/3 cup shallot, finely chopped
- 1/4 teaspoon Dijon mustard
- 3/4 cup chardonnay1/2 cup cream
- 1 cup of dried apricots, sliced
- 2 teaspoons of fresh thyme leaves
- 1 box Ben's fast cook wild rice, cooked

Roasted Asparagus

- 1 bunch of thin asparagus
- 1 tablespoon olive oil
- 1/4 teaspoon kosher salt

Preheat the oven to 375 degrees. Pat the chicken breasts dry with a paper towel and season with salt and pepper. Place a large skillet on medium heat and add 2 tablespoons of olive oil. When the pan is hot, add the chicken and cook on each side until golden brown. Once the chicken is browned remove it to a plate. The chicken will finish cooking when returned to the sauce.

Turn the heat to medium low. Add 1 tablespoon of butter to the pan. Next, add in the shallots and cook till translucent. Then turn the heat up to medium and deglaze the pan by adding ¾ cup of white wine. Cook the wine a minute, making sure to get all of the delicious brown bits on the bottom of

the pan. Whisk in the Dijon mustard. Add the apricots, cream and thyme and stir. Return the chicken breasts to the pan and cover the skillet part way with a lid. Let the sauce simmer and chicken cook for about 8 to 10 minutes until it is cooked through.

While the chicken is simmering, make the wild rice according to the package instructions and the roasted asparagus. Cut the ends off the asparagus spears and place them in bowl. Add 1 tablespoon of olive oil and 1/4 teaspoon of salt. Stir to coat the asparagus in the oil. Place the asparagus in a single layer on a sheet pan lined with parchment paper. Roast for 10 minutes. Serves 4.







# Undefeated SIJ earns championship

Eighth-grade boys basketball team ends season with 46-0 record and three-peat

Ending the season as the undefeated champs is pretty impressive for any basketball team. Ending a three-year middle school season that way — as did the boys basketball team at St. Isaac Jogues School in Hinsdale — is a remarkable accomplishment.

Players and their head coach credit the run to one thing: team chemistry.

Ryan Williams of Hinsdale said he's been playing with teammates Will Barclay and Justin Kurkowski in Hinsdale Inferno basketball since elementary school.

"Since third grade, we're always like, 'I can't wait to play basketball at St. Isaac Jogues,'" he said. "When the team came together, it was just like we were ready. We had the chemistry already. We were really good friends. It was a perfect way to start sixth grade."

Many team members also have the advantage of having been classmates since kindergarten, Will said.

"We're in school together for nine years now, and we know each other really well. We know each other's strengths and weaknesses and we also trust each other. Also our coaches are really good," he said.

The team is coached by assistant Mark Williams and head coach Mike Kurkowski, Justin's dad.

"I liked having him as a coach," Justin said. "I feel like he put in a lot of effort and energy into coaching our team.

His dad said the players made his job easy.

"I would go into some games and say, 'I don't want to do a lot of coaching tonight guys,' and they would take care of the rest," he said.

St. Isaac Jogues athletic director Julie Potts believes the coaches' decision to let the boys work together as a team contributed to their success

'As the AD, I'm at all the home games and I watch," Potts said. "I watch some coaches that are passionate, and through their passion feel they need to be coaching even when the kids are on the court. That is not Mike and Mark.

"I think that is one of the reasons these boys have played so well together," she continued. "They've had to play. They have to figure it out. It's fun to watch. It's a unique experience."

Kurkowski said there was something special about this group of players that made that possible.

"It just seemed very organic with them and they played really well," he said. "You can't recreate it. It's those kids playing together and the way they interact with each other on and off the court is different."

He credited Ryan, Will and Justin for setting the tone for the team.


Those three kids were very good leaders, very unselfish, and I think that rubs off on the whole team. They all play so well together and so unselfish," he said.

Those relationships create a more relaxed environment on the court.

"You know you can trust them," Ryan said. "I don't have to be the best scorer or the best player. I can trust my teammates.

Some of the teams we played, there was one guy trying to do it all. On our team, we had a job to do and we tried to do it well. And if somebody was having a bad game, we would all step up.'

Potts noted that as well.





"This team certainly has some boys who are very gifted, but when you watch them play, it's not easy to see who would be the standout because they play so well together," she said.

The boys were so in tune with each other that sometimes Potts couldn't tell if a player knew he was about to receive a pass.

"Some of the passes, they make your heart kind of skip a beat," she said.

Kurkowski said the team's growing winning streak didn't change his coaching over his three years of working with the team.

"The last practice we do at the end of the year, I tell them we are going to go back to the things we did at the first practice of the season," he said.

Focusing on the basics helped keep the team from thinking too much about the playoffs or what was at stake.

'Keep it simple and keep it basic and let them do the rest and take over," he said.

After beating Notre

Dame 48-32 in the first playoff game of the Suburban Parochial League, SIJ went into the final game against Visitation with a 45-game winning streak. They won easily with a score of 54-31. The team established an early 20-7 lead, Ryan said, creating some great energy.

"Our fans came, so that was fun. We were all having a good time," he said. "There's so much school spirit at St. Isaac Jogues, Will said. "Lots of our classmates and our teachers and even our priest, Father Burke (Masters), came to support us in our final game. That motivated us."

Watching the team win its third championship was exciting — and instructive — for Kurkowski.

"That's when you could really tell the pressure was building too much with them. They are a pretty calm, cool, collected group. When they won that third one you could tell they were very relieved, happy," he said.

"That's one of the best
